### 2020 HARTLAND MEMORIAL DAY PARADE FLOAT AND POLITICAL PARTICIPANT RULES AND REGULATIONS

## *"Hartland's 85<sup>th</sup> Memorial Day Parade - A Proud Tradition"* INFORMATION FOR ALL FLOAT ENTRIES

### The following rules <u>MUST</u> be observed:

- ALL FLOATS will be inspected for possible safety hazards. The committee reserves the right to prohibit obviously unsafe entries from participation in the Parade.
- Participants shall not be allowed to ride and/or perform on floats under the following conditions:
- Exposed to open rotary equipment, belts, pulleys and other such devices.
- Devices and/or platforms not well secured while performing.
- Handrails and/or bars have NOT been provided.
- Because throwing objects from vehicles/floats creates a safety hazard for children along the parade route, please have Parade walkers <u>hand out</u> candy or objects to the audience.
- Dancing or similar activities are not allowed on floats while in motion.
- The display and/or distribution of political/campaign material is prohibited (see Political Rules).
- No motorized bicycles or scooters are allowed to participate in the Parade.
- Please be sure to STAY ON your float until SAFELY STOPPED AT VILLAGE ELEMENTARY PARKING LOT.
- Parade Float Judging will begin at Hartland Middle School at Ore Creek at 10:45 AM, Monday May 25, 2020 MEMORIAL DAY. Floats arriving after 10:45 AM will not be judged. All other Parade participants must be at Ore Creek Middle School <u>no later than 11:00 AM</u>. The Parade begins at 12 Noon.

### **POLITICAL PARTICIPATION REGULATIONS**

The Hartland Memorial Parade is traditionally a non-partisan, non-political event.

### PARADE RULES

Politicians MAY wear simple name tags. NO oversize name buttons.
Politicians MAY hand out candy but NOT with political writing printed on it.
Politicians are NOT allowed to hand out literature while walking in the parade.
Politicians may NOT wear T-shirts with candidate's names or issues printed on shirts.
Politicians may NOT carry signs, banners, or flags depicting political information or ride or drive in cars or floats or on bicycles with political signage.

### PARK RULES

Politicians MAY purchase a booth in the park if planning to hand out literature. Politicians MUST stay at or in Booth with Literature in park. Public needs to come to the booth to pick up literature.

Politicians MAY meet and greet public before and after parade in park. Politicians MAY wear T-shirts with candidate's names on them while in park area. If having music and or a performer(s) at a booth, all music or action must stop

during the Pavilion concert.

All Booths, T-shirts, and Signage should be in good taste.

The above regulations apply to all politicians, candidates, and their supporters.
